

OPTION A FOUNDATION PROGRAMME

OPTION B SHORT PREPARATORY COURSE FOR UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

MEDICAL STUDIES AT LINGUAVIVA 2026

Our Campus in Florence prepares students for degree programmes in Medical Studies with selective entries which require an admission test: Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary, Pharmacy, Technical Health Professions.

Students will be prepared both in Italian language and University admission tests.

We offer also a preparatory course for degree courses in Medicine taught in English and IMAT (International Medical Admission Test)

Exam dates

After the first semester at university

National Admission test

Students must take the 3 exams of the Filter Semester, Biology, Chemistry and Physics. The total score will be the result of the three combined scores.

Each exam has a maximum score of 31, so the maximum total score possible is 93. A minimum score of 18/31 is required on each of the exams.

Ranking

The ranking is built up considering the best total scores according to the number of places available in each single University.

Italian Language Test

To enroll on any Italian University for first level degree, students are requested to sit for an Italian language exam of Level B2. The Italian language exam is held on different dates between April and September.

Passing this exam is a compulsory requirement for admission to the chosen University course or to the admission examination for specific Degree studies. Most universities have adopted ITA-L2 test, organized by CISIA, which is a computer-based, multiple-choice test composed of 3 parts (listening, reading and grammar) of increasing difficulty.

The questions are multiple-choice with 3 alternatives, one of which is correct. Students who already have CILS, CELI, PLIDA certification for level B2, are exempted from Italian language exam.

In order to study Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary in an Italian University students need to pass a national admission test with restricted access.

The test takes place simultaneously in all Italian state universities that provide a degree course in Medicine and Surgery or Veterinary.

The test is administered directly by the Italian Ministry of Education.

IMAT ADMISSION TEST

The admission exam is a pen-and-paper test, consisting of a total of 60 multiplechoice questions. All questions have five options,

of which only one is correct. Candidates have 100 minutes to complete the test. Topics included in the IMAT admission test:

- Reading skills and knowledge acquired during studies: 4 questions
- Logical Reasoning and problem solving: 5 questions
- Biology: 23 questions Chemistry: 15 questions
- Mathematics and Physics: 13 questions

ARCHITECTURE STUDIES AT LINGUAVIVA 2026

Our Campus in Milan prepares students for Architecture studies in Italian and English language, which has a selective entry determined by a national admission test

KEY FEATURES OF LOCAL UNIVERSITY ADMISSION EXAMS FOR ARCHITECTURE

Exam dates

July and September. Each university sets a date for the test.

Examination body

The admission exams are administered at local level, but The Ministry of University decides

on the number of places allocated to each University.

The architecture test is computer based and managed by a university testing centre.

Italian Language Test

To enroll on any Italian University for first level degree, students are requested to sit for an Italian language exam of Level B2. The Italian language exam is held on different dates between May and September. Passing this exam is a compulsory requirement for admission to the chosen University course or to the admission examination for specific Degree studies. Most universities have adopted ITA-L2 test, organized by CISIA, which is a computer-based, multiple-choice test composed of 3 parts (listening, reading and grammar) of increasing difficulty. The questions are multiple-choice with 3 alternatives, one of which is correct. Students who already have CILS, CELI, PLIDA certification for level B2, are exempted from Italian language exam.

Admission test

Most universities in Italy use ARCHED as admission test for Bachelor programmes in Architecture or single cycle degree in Architecture & Building Engineering.

ARCHED is a computer-based and multiplechoice test, made of 50 questions divided in 5 sections: Text comprehension, Logical Reasoning, Knowledge acquired during previous studies (comprising History, History of Art and Architecture, General culture), Drawing and Visualization, Mathematics and Physics. For Politecnico di Milano students taking the test in Italian language, at the end of the

Test Arched, they will need to take an English Language Test with further 30 questions.

Politecnico di Torino runs its own test TIL-A maintaining the same format.

Politecnico di Milano and Politecnico di Torino offer the possibility of a test in English Language for students wanting to study a full degree course in Architecture in English.

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

For Non-EU students residing abroad there is no minimum score.

The ranking is built up considering the best scores according to the number of available places.

ARCHITECTURE TEST

ARCHED is a computer-based and multiple- choice test, consisting of a total of 50 multiple- choice questions.
All questions have five options, of which only one is correct.

Candidates have 100 minutes to complete the test and the format is as follows:

- Text comprehension: 10 questions
- Knowledge acquired during previous studies, History and General culture (History, History of Art, General culture): 10 questions
- Drawing and Visualization: 10 questions
- Logical Reasoning: 10 questions
- Mathematics and Physics: 10 questions

DESIGN STUDIES AT LINGUAVIVA 2026

Our Campus in Milan prepares students for Design studies in Italian language. Admission to all bachelor courses is with a selective admission test.

The course focuses on the syllabus requested by the most important Italian Universities.

KEY FEATURES OF LOCAL UNIVERSITY ADMISSION EXAMS FOR DESIGN

Exam dates

July, August, September. Each University sets different dates.

Examination body

The admission exams are organized by the local universities.

Italian Language Test

To enroll on any Italian University for first level degree, students are requested to sit for an Italian language exam of Level B2. The Italian language exam is held on different dates between July and September. Passing this exam is a compulsory requirement for admission to the chosen University course or to the admission examination for specific Degree studies. Most universities have adopted ITA-L2 test which is a computer based test, multiplechoice test composed of 3 parts (listening, reading and grammar) of increasing difficulty. The questions are multiple-choice with 3 alternatives, one of which is correct. Students who already have CILS, CELI, PLIDA certification for level B2, are exempted from Italian language exam.

Local Admission test

The admissions exams are different in each University and take place on different dates. Some are paper based and some are computer based.

Grading System

Usually 1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

Depends on University and their admission test rules

DESIGN TEST AT POLYTECHNIC OF MILAN

This test is valid for all design degrees offered at Polytechnic of Milan: product design, interior design, fashion design and communication design. The admission exam is a computer test, consisting of a total of 60 multiple-choice questions.

All questions have five options, of which only one is correct. Candidates have 120 minutes to complete the test and the format is as follows:

- History of Art and Design:
 12 questions.
- Geometry and Representation:
 12 questions.
- Verbal Comprehension: 6 questions.
- Logical Reasoning: 6 questions.
- General Knowledge: 24 questions.
- English Language Test: 30 questions (the result is only to assess if students need extra courses for English language during the academic year). You have to take the English test even if you have certifications of your English language skills.

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

Students are required to answer correctly a minimum number of questions in each section:

History of Art and Design: 2 Geometry and Representation: 2 Verbal Comprehension: 1 Logical Reasoning: 1 General Knowledge: 5

English Language Test: not requested.

For EU students: 30/100 Design test; 24/30 English Language test. For Non-EU students residing abroad: 20/100 Design test; 24/30 English Language test.

DESIGN TEST AT POLYTECHNIC OF TURIN

The admission exam is a computer test, consisting of a total of 42 multiple-choice questions.

All questions have five options, of which only one is correct. Candidates have 90 minutes to complete the test and the format is as follows:

- History of Art and Design:
 12 questions.
- Logic and Mathematics: 12 questions.
- Text Comprehension: 6 questions.
- General Knowledge: 12 questions.

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

For all students 20/100 to access ranking. If students obtain 70/100, they are guaranteed a place in Design

DESIGN TEST AT UNIVERSITY IUAV OF VENICE

This is a paper-based test divided in different areas. The test is made of 3 parts: written, drawing and a motivational interview.

The test format is as follows:

- General Knowledge, Text
 Comprehension, History of Art,
 Fashion and Design: 40 multiple choice questions, candidates have 1 hour to complete the test.
- Graphic Test Candidates are asked to draw, elaborate in graphic form a theme given by the exam board.
 They have 1 hour to complete the test.
- Motivational interview: Candidates will be interviewed on their motivation to study design.

Grading System

Max. 30 points written test Max. 30 points graphic test

Max. 40 points motivational interview

Minimum score

For all students 20/60 in written and graphic test areas.

Students will be prepared both in Italian language and University admission tests. This course is suitable for students wishing to study Industrial Design, Product Design, Interior Design, Fashion Design, Visual and Communication Design.

DESIGN TEST AT UNIVERSITY OF FLORENCE

The University of Florence employs ARCHED, a computer-based and multiplechoice test, which is utilized for Architecture

ARCHED test consists of a total of 50 multiple- choice questions.

All questions have five options, of which only one is correct. Candidates have 100 minutes to complete the test and the format is as follows:

- Text comprehension: 10 questions.
- Knowledge acquired during previous studies, History and General culture (History, History of Art, General culture): 10 questions.
- Drawing and Visualization: 10 questions.
- Logical Reasoning: 10 questions.
- Mathematics and Physics: 10 questions

The test is designed to accommodate two study tracks in the field of design: Product, Interior, Communication and Eco-Social Design, as well as Textile and Fashion Design.

Students have the flexibility to take the test in July and September, with the option

to choose one or both study tracks.

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

The ranking is built up considering the best scores according to the number of available places. When calculating the overall test score, the marks achieved in the physics and mathematics sections will not be considered. The maximum achievable score is 40, and students who score 25 points or lower will be obligated to enroll in supplementary courses during the first semester.

ENGINEERING STUDIES AT LINGUAVIVA 2026

Our Campus in Milan prepares students for Engineering Studies in Italian language. Admission to all bachelor courses is with a selective admission test.

The admission exams are different in each University and take place on different dates. Most of the Italian Universities for Engineering have adopted a common multiple-choice computer-based test TOLC-I.

KEY FEATURES OF LOCAL UNIVERSITY ADMISSION EXAMS FOR ENGINEERING

Exam dates

July, August, September

Examination body

The admission exams are organized by the local universities.

Italian Language Test

To enroll on any Italian University for first level degree, students are requested to sit for an Italian language exam of Level B2. The Italian language exam is held on different dates between July and September. Passing this exam is a compulsory requirement for admission to the chosen University course or to the admission examination for specific Degree studies. Most universities have adopted ITA-L2 test which is a computerbased test, multiple-choice test composed of 3 parts (listening, reading and grammar) of increasing difficulty. The questions are multiple-choice with 3 alternatives, one of which is correct.

Students who already have CILS, CELI, PLIDA certification for level B2, are exempted from Italian language exam.

TOLC-I ENGINEERING TEST

The admission exam is a computer-based test. The TOLC-I structure consists of 50 questions divided into 4 sections.

Candidates have 110 minutes to complete them. 15 minutes are allocated to complete the English language test.

Total time is 125 minutes.

Regarding the English TOLC-I test, it follows the same format as the regular test, but without the inclusion of the English Language section. Candidates are given 110 minutes in total to complete this test.

The format is as follows:

 Mathematics: 20 questions
 Science (Chemistry and Physics): 10 questions

- Reading Comprehension: 10 questions

Logic: 10 questions

- English Language Test: 30 questions

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer. For the English language proficiency test, there is no penalty for incorrect answers. The score is determined by awarding 1 point for correct answers and 0 points for incorrect or no answers.

Minimum score

Depends on university and their admission test rules

ENGINEERING TEST AT POLYTECHNIC OF MILAN

This test is valid for all engineering degrees offered at Polytechnic of Milan.

The admission exam is a computer-based test, consisting of a total of 65 multiple-choice questions.

All questions have five options, of which only one is correct.

EU or equivalent students can take the test up to three times between February and July.

Non-EU students who need a Visa can take the test once in July.

Candidates have 100 minutes to complete the test and the format is as follows:

- Mathematics, Logic and Statistics:
- 25 questions
- Physics: 5 questions
- Verbal Comprehension: 5 questions
- **English Language Test:** 30 questions (the result is only to assess if students need extra courses for English language during the academic year).

You have to take the English test even if you have certifications of your English language skills.

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

60/100 is the minimum score to pass the test. 24/30 English Language test Less than 60/100 students will be allocated Compulsory Educational Supplements, extra courses in Math or Physics. Less than 24/30 in English Language test students will have to attend additional English courses.

ENGINEERING TEST AT POLYTECHNIC OF TURIN (TIL-I)

This test is valid for all engineering degrees offered at Polytechnic of Turin.

EU or equivalent students can take the test up to three times between March and September. Non-EU students who need a Visa can take the test up to three times between March and May.

The admission exam is a computer-based test, consisting of a total of 42 multiple-choice questions.

All questions have five options, of which only one is correct.

Candidates have 90 minutes to complete the test and the format is as follows:

- Mathematics: 16 questions
- Physics: 10 questions
- Text Comprehension and Logic: 10 questions
- Basic Technical Knowledge: 6 questions

Grading System

1 point for each correct answer -0,25 points for each wrong answer 0 points for no answer

Minimum score

20/100 minimum score to access ranking. If students obtain 60/100, they are guaranteed a place the chosen Engineering degree.

If students score is less than 60/100 they may wait for the ranking to see the final placement or alternatively they make take the TIL-I test again in one or more subsequent sessions,

the result of the last test cancels the previously acquired one.

If the test is repeated, the best result obtained will be considered valid.

The course is suitable for students wishing to prepare TOLC-I test.

The course is suitable also for students wanting to study at Polytechnic of Milan and Polytechnic of Turin, which have their own admission test different from TOLC-I exam. Students will be prepared both in Italian language and University admission tests.


